Teton County Integrated Solid Waste & Recycling (ISWR) is pleased to offer an expansion of its RRR outreach program to include students and teachers for the 2017-2018 school year.

Why study Solid Waste?

Because...46,000 tons of solid waste were generated in Teton County in 2016.

Because...38% of this material (**17,600 tons**) was recovered through Reuse, Recycling and Composting.

Because...Teton County plans to do more...on the Road to Zero Waste!

Because... You don't want to waste this opportunity!

What is RRR?

Reduce, Reuse and Recycle (the 3 R's) represent the building blocks of Teton County's Road to Zero Waste, a strategy approved in 2014 to minimize landfill bound waste and achieve a more sustainable community. The current goal is to progress from 38% diversion from landfill to 60% by the year 2030.

Who will RRR Student Leaders be working with?

Teton County Integrated Solid Waste and Recycling (ISWR) oversees programs and services to reduce, reuse, recycle and compost and manages municipal solid waste operations, regional household hazardous waste collection and associated community outreach and education events and activities.

What Can Students Do?

K-12 students, student groups and educators can build their own solid waste/waste diversion course of study. This can include a wide array of customized classroom instruction, field trips, hands-on projects, community volunteering and independent research.
